

Patient Instructions for COVID-19 Monoclonal Antibody Infusions

After a designated infusion site receives an infusion order from your doctor, a scheduling representative will contact you to arrange an infusion appointment. **The appointment must be scheduled within 10 days from the date of symptom onset that is listed on random allocation system entry form.**

On the day of your scheduled infusion:

1. Arrive and park at the designated location, see the following pages for site-specific instructions.
2. A surgical (not cloth) mask must be worn at all times.
3. You may be instructed to contact a care team member upon arrival (see pages 2-4 for site-specific instructions). It is important that you follow the instructions and limit travel only between the infusion center and your vehicle to avoid exposing others to the virus.
Note: No additional people will be allowed to be with you at the infusion appointment. If you are having someone drive you to the appointment, they can drop you off at the appropriate site and then return to pick you up in about 3 hours.
4. When you arrive, staff will check your vital signs (temperature, blood pressure, heart rate, respiratory rate) and check oxygen level. If your vital signs are unstable and/or your oxygen level is below 90%, you will not be able to receive the infusion and will be referred for urgent medical assistance based on the local infusion protocol.
5. You should plan to be at the infusion center for up to 3 hours. Upon arrival, a nurse will check you in, start an IV and prepare you for the infusion. The medication will infuse over 30-60 minutes. You will be observed for 1 hour after the infusion is complete to monitor for medication reactions. You may bring a book to read or something else to do.
6. When your visit is completed, you will be instructed to proceed directly back to your vehicle via the same route used for entering the facility.
7. PLEASE WEAR YOUR MASK AT ALL TIMES.
8. DO NOT linger around the hospital or stop by other areas including the cafeteria, pharmacy, etc. Please return home to continue isolation. Please continue routine measures to limit spread of the virus: practice physical distancing, wear a mask, wash your hands.
9. Please follow-up with your primary care provider in 1-2 weeks, or sooner as needed, and report any side effects to your provider.

Please seek immediate medical attention if at any time you develop a significant worsening of symptoms, difficulty breathing, or decrease in oxygen levels.

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



4. A surgical mask (not a cloth mask) should be worn at all times. If you do not have one, a surgical mask will be provided on arrival.


